Hello Friends,

This year we celebrate nine years of community-led service, as Natopiwo Organization continues to deliver practical, life-enriching support and opportunities to Maasai communities across northern Tanzania amidst pressing challenges. Over the past year, our early childhood education program experienced an incredible 96% surge in enrollment, welcoming 98 preschool children alongside our ongoing support for secondary and college students. Additionally, we expanded our women's empowerment initiatives through literacy and vocational tailoring classes. We collaborated with the community to mitigate severe local soil erosion. Internationally, we solidified our operational foundation by sharing vital education research at Oxford University and other UK and US universities and organizations. We also continue our valued collaboration with our US-based nonprofit partner, Natopiwo Partners; Rotary and Eco Rotary Clubs in the US; the French NGO Terre O Vent; and two family foundations. We extend our deepest gratitude to you, our global partners whose generous donations and ongoing collaboration makes these many sustainable, community-centered successes possible. **Thank you - ashe naleng!**

Natopiwo Preschool

As our longest-running program, the Natopiwo Preschool has consistently served as the main entry point to education for children from low-income households in the community.



Women's Health Education



One of our newest initiatives is the organization of workshops aimed at promoting women's health and wellbeing through education and support surrounding reproductive health. This workshop has been a frequent request from members of the community, leading to classes being held in both December of 2025 and most recently July of 2026. Participants highlighted the necessity of extending these lessons to the broader community, including men as well as women.

Community Tree Planting



1000+ Trees Planted The trees planted provide shade and protect fragile soil from erosion, reducing gully formation.



Seeds are sown in the minds of students, which inspires environmental awareness, action, and community-led conservation .

Drought Relief Keeps The Community Going



When both the short and long rains failed to fall this year, extreme water scarcity led to thirst and, soon after, hunger in the community. With the help of generous donors, Natopiwo stepped in to provide **\$10,000** worth of water and food relief, prioritizing children and women.

Literacy classes and vocational training for the community

Women's Literacy Class

Started to support mothers who wanted to help their children with homework, and has now evolved into a **confidence-building initiative** and opportunity for Maasai women to shape their futures. Teacher salaries and all materials paid for by Natopiwo and our donors.



The program has recently expanded to help women manage small responsibilities that require reading and writing skills so they can understand basic written health, marketplace, and civic information.



For example, one attendee has now started her **own** garment repair business and has now become a role model for other women looking to have an income.

Women's Sewing Class

Fully funded opportunity for more community members to learn and grow their sewing skills. Since its initiation in 2024, the class has doubled the number of machines from 2 to 4 thanks to generous donations. The expanded program has led to more attendees developing skills that lead them to become leaders and teachers in the community.



Family Health



An innovative family health initiative is now available for **both men and women**. Originally designed for women to teach family spacing, the program was expanded to include men at the direct request of the women. The curriculum promotes health and shared household decision-making.



Climate Awareness Community Conferences

Monthly gatherings of Indigenous Maasai leaders in Monduli Juu to talk through the climate mitigation strategies that their communities need to implement: harvesting rainwater, resetting and restoring grazing lands, reimagining what a herd looks like, investing in education, and backing women's economic groups.

Educational Support



Natopiwo has continued to support local children in their secondary school education, with a focus on youth from households that face significant barriers and would otherwise struggle to continue learning due to extreme financial constraints, loss of parents, or the absence of consistent support at home.

Erosion Mitigation



As erosion remains a critical issue in Monduli Juu, Natopiwo has continued their investment into erosion control and prevention. This work builds off of the increased presence of Natopiwo-led and community-led climate conferences that raise awareness for the importance of stewardship. Investment in sandbags and materials used to create safe paths is critical.

Partnering in 2027

As we enter the next fiscal year, the Monduli Juu community and Natopiwo, working together, have identified some key goals, and with your help, we can **make them a reality**. Year after year, more students graduate from Natopiwo preschool and need assistance to continue pursuing their educational dreams. We are hoping to raise an additional \$10,000 USD to support these cohorts of older students. In addition, following years of requests from the community and a gift of land from the local government, we hope to break ground on the Natopiwo Women's Community Center. By shifting the women's literacy, financial, and vocational training from the preschool to its own center, this will increase the capacity for Natopiwo to provide high quality early childhood education while, at the same time, empowering local women to continue their education and advance wellbeing.

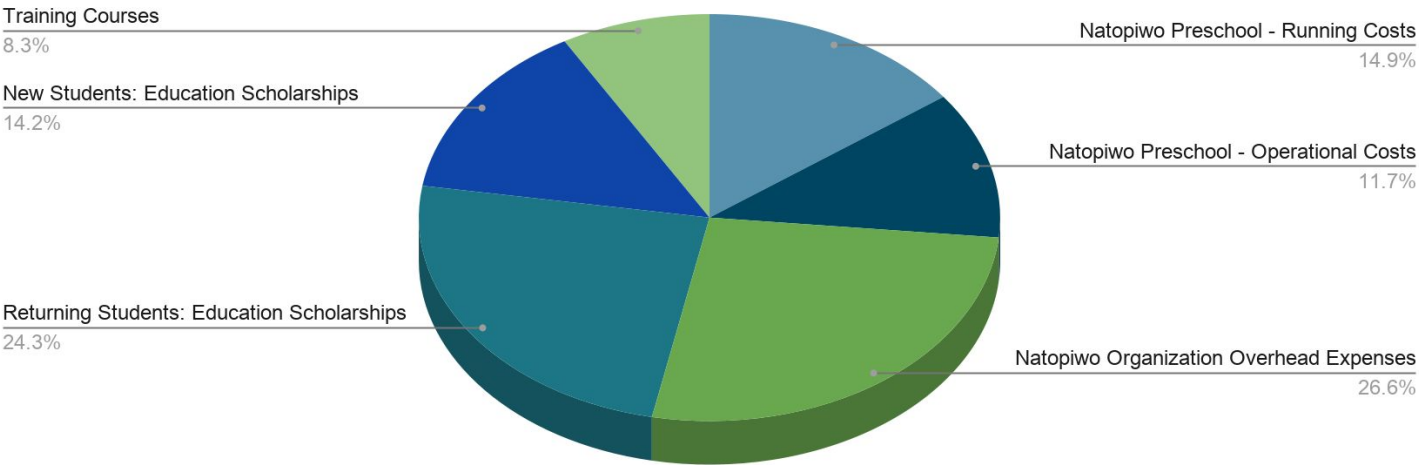
